Prospective Honors Program students are urged to acquaint themselves as early as possible with the requirements above, as well as with the particular procedures for acceptance into the English Department's Honors Program. See the departmental honors advisor or the Honors Program Director for this information.

Area Options. One of the two required area options must be in a foreign language. For the second area option (9 credits), cultural studies, values inquiry, or the foundations of western civilization is recommended.

1. Foreign Language (Required). Students must complete **one** of the following:

- 211 in any foreign language
- Frn 205 or Ger 205 or Lat 205, Ptg 205 or Spn 205
- Placement out of 211

2. CS, VI, WC _____ _____ _____

General Program in English Requirements. Thirty credits in English at the 200 level or above, including 18 credits at the 300 or 400 series level. No more than 6 total credits may come from 202, 203, and 208. Within the 30 credits, the following are required:

- A. ENG 204 or 205 or 206 or 207; and **ENG 241**.
- B. A course in American or American ethnic literature.
- C. A writing course from the 200 series or above.
- D. Two courses at the 300 level or above in British literature before 1800.
- E. **ENG 400** or equivalent.
- F. Completion of an Individual Major Portfolio.

Please note:

- 33 of the 120 credit hours must be at 300 level or above.

Honors Independent Requirements

- Eng./Hon. 494 (off campus preparation course)
- Eng./Hon. 495 (4 cr.) Honors Thesis I (off campus)
- Eng./Hon. 496 (4 cr.) Honors Thesis II

Note: A Y (work in progress) grade is assigned for these classes until the work is completed. This does not count as an Incomplete on the student's transcript when applying to graduate and professional schools.

Important: 40/65 Hour Rule for the BA Only

- No more than 40 credits in your major
- Cross-listed courses taken through the alternate department do not count in the 40/65 hour rule
- No more than 65 credits in your combined major and minor may count toward the total credits required for graduation
- Eng. 100, 109, 111, and 112 excluded from the 40/65 Hour Rule
