

OFFICES OFFERING STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

Office of Housing and Residential Life, 375 UCEN, 237-6571. The Housing community, staff and students alike, work to create and maintain an environment that is open to and respectful of individuals across the spectrum of human differences and distinctions. We work collectively to examine our values and conduct, and to question those values when they reflect an origin of fear, anger, or ignorance. Acts of bigotry are acts of hatred against us all, and they will not be condoned or tolerated. We continue to strive towards fulfilling our ideals.

Accessibility Services, 264 UCEN, 762-3456. The Office of Accessibility Services provides a supportive environment that enables students with disabilities the opportunity to develop to their maximum academic and personal potential. Students with documented disabilities may request modifications, accommodations, auxiliary aids enabling them to participate in and benefit from all postsecondary educational programs and activities.

Campus Counselor-Student Development Center, 264 UCEN, 762-3456. Counseling services are dedicated to assisting students in working through personal difficulties, academic issues, and crisis in order to help maximize the educational experience.

Department of Public Safety, 102 Hubbard, 762-3335. The Department of Public Safety is responsible for providing a safe environment on campus properties, owned, leased or operated by the University of Michigan-Flint. Our goals are to prevent crime on campus and to protect and assist students, faculty, staff and visitors to the campus with security related problems.

Diversity Education Services (DES), 217 UCEN, 762-3169. The mission of DES is to foster positive changes in the attitudes and perceptions of UM-Flint students, faculty and staff, and individuals and organizations in the local community. Through training, guidance and consultation, an increased awareness and acceptance of a multitude of cultural values will contribute to a campus climate that embraces differences and encourages inclusiveness. Issues regarding, race, gender, sexual orientation, disability awareness, access and equity will be the primary philosophical thrusts of DES programming and services.

Ellen Bommarito (LGBT) Center, 365 UCEN, 766-6606. While the LGBT Center's services are focused on issues related to LGBT students, faculty, and staff, we cater to all members of the campus community, regardless of sexual orientation and/or gender identity and expression. For example, we offer free safer-sex materials (latex and non-latex condoms, dental dams, female condoms, lube, etc.). We also do education related to sexuality, sexual identity, and gender identity and expression.

International Student Center (ISC), 219 UCEN, 762-0867. The ISC is responsible for the supportive services of immigration and acculturation for all incoming international students from more than 20 countries. In conjunction with the student group International Student Organization (ISO), the ISC sponsors the activities of UM-Flint's International Education Week, a world-wide celebration. The ISC office harbors a student lounge and everyone is welcome. Domestic students are always encouraged to participate in ISC activities.

Office of the Ombuds, 237 UPAV, 762-3434. The Office of the Ombuds is a safe environment where students and members of the University of Michigan-Flint community may go for assistance in resolving conflicts, disputes, or complaints on an informal basis.

Office of Student Life, 361 UCEN, 762-3431, The Office of Student Life is dedicated to enhancing the educational experience of all UM- Flint students, by providing co-curricular programs that are engaging, welcoming, and diverse while connecting students to experiences that promote creativity, community, and responsibility. We provide activities dedicated to student leadership development, self awareness and personal growth, cultural diversity, campus civility, and student safety, experiential learning and community involvement, social and cultural activities. We also provide students with university information, and student support and mentoring.

Urban Health and Wellness Center, 1153 WSW, 810-424-5269. The Urban Health and Wellness Center provides outpatient healthcare services for currently enrolled UM-Flint students. Hours of operation include: Primary Care: Monday through Thursday 9:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. and Physical Therapy: Monday through Friday 9:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. **(By Appointment Only)**

Women's Educational Center (WEC), 359 UCEN, 237-6648. The WEC supports women (students, faculty, and staff) as they fulfill their educational and career goals. We also offer programs that raise awareness about women's issues. We monitor the status of women on campus, advocating for practices and policies that promote equal participation. In addition, we advocate for and support women and men working together to challenge attitudes and social constructs that promote unequal treatment based on gender, race, sexual orientation, etc.
