Microwave Shelf Dimensions

Microwave shelf size: 27 inches wide, 19 ¾ inches in total clear height and 20 ½ inches deep from front edge of shelf to rear wood panel. Most small counter top model microwaves will fit within this size cabinet with room to spare

FURNITURE

Suite/Room Furniture

Each suite is fully furnished and below you will find specific information on bedroom, living room, and dining room furniture. Wastebaskets are provided in the bedrooms, bathrooms, and kitchen. The suite is also provided with one recycling container per resident. All rooms have overhead lighting, but residents can bring additional lights for studying if needed. Blinds are installed on all the windows.

Please remember it's up to you and your roommate/suitemates to give your room a personality and make it your own. Bring pictures and decorative items from home to make your room more comfortable.

Bedroom Furniture

All of the residence hall suites are outfitted in a new, versatile furniture called Lifespace. It allows residents to maximize space and customize their rooms with a variety of configurations— including loft options. The bedroom is furnished with a desk with attached organizer, desk chair, chest of drawers, bookcase, ladder, bed and mattress.

Housing and Residential Life provides mattresses that are fire and flame-resistant. Residents may not substitute another mattress. **When you are purchasing linens and bedding to bring to campus, you should look for extra-long styles. Standard twin size sheets will NOT fit your bed.** Sales staff at department or linen stores will be able to help you determine what linens and bedding to purchase for the

36" x 80" mattress. You will receive a letter from [On Campus Marketing](#) a company that Housing and Residential Life is working with. They will give you information for purchasing bedding and other items for your bedroom that are guaranteed to fit.

You may be happy with the configuration of the modular furniture you find in your room at Move-In, but if you want to change it we can show you how to do it safely and easily. You won't need any tools or training. You can find information on various designs by following the link below or reading the information brochure attached to your furniture.

Please note that since the loft configuration is available with modular furniture, no custom-built, leased or individually owned lofts may be installed in rooms.

Living Room Furniture

A sofa, chair, coffee table, side table (2), dining room table, and dining room chairs are provided for you.

Bathroom

Bathrooms come with a sink, shower, toilet, shower curtain, robe hook and towel bar.

Kitchen

The kitchen includes a sink, stove top, refrigerator and cabinets.

AMENITIES

Phones

Phones are not provided in the suites so a cell phone is necessary. There are phones available in the hallways for emergency and campus use.

Storage

The Office of Housing and Residential Life does not provide student storage. Students may be able to arrange for storage on their own and at their own risk and expense through a local commercial vendor.

Electrical Items

Electrical equipment and appliances must be UL-certified (UL stands for [Underwriters Laboratory](#)). Look for the UL mark.



Extension Cords—only 16-gauge or lower permitted

Power Strips—with integrated (built-in) circuit breakers only permitted

We strongly recommend that you use a 15-amp power strip (with integrated circuit breaker) if the number of electrical items in your room exceeds the number of outlets. These multiple-connection strips are much safer than the lower-cost rubber adapters.

In addition to electrical load consideration, unsafe or excessive electrical devices can pose a fire hazard. For more about permitted and prohibited items, see [A Residents Guide to Community Living](#). University Housing and Residential Life reserves the right to require the removal of any fire hazard, regardless of its inclusion or exclusion from these guidelines, in a student suite or elsewhere in the residence hall.

Cable TV

A cable TV outlet will be provided at no cost in the living room and bedrooms of each suite. TVs are not provided in the suites or rooms.



Laundry Facilities

Our residence hall has washers and dryers available to residents on each floor. Washers cost one dollar per load and the dryers cost 75 cents per load (prices subject to change).

Computers & Networking

Our residence hall is completely wireless.

What to Bring to Campus

This "[What to Bring to Campus](#)" list is a general overview of the items that one might expect to use in a typical residence hall facility.

Vending

Vending machines will be located on the 1st floor next to the front desk. Soft drinks, juice, water and snacks are available.

Printing Station

There is a printing station located in the residence hall. Students can send documents to this printing station from their residence hall suite or anywhere on campus and then go there to finish the printing process.

Lounges

Lounges are located on each floor. These spaces can be used for residence hall programs, studying or socializing.
