

## **The Olivia P. Maynard and Olof Karlstrom Faculty Award for Civic Engagement**

Due to a generous gift from Regent Olivia P. Maynard and Olof Karlstrom, University Outreach and Academic Affairs will grant one \$1500 faculty stipend per academic year for excellence in civic engagement.

### **Nomination**

Nominations should be submitted to the chair of the SASE Committee, c/o Provost 's Office, 229 University Pavilion. The letter of nomination is due by January 22, 2010 and supporting documents are due by March 8, 2010. The nomination packet will be kept active for three academic years.

### **Required Supporting Documentation**

- A 2-3 page essay that specifically addresses the faculty member's engagement efforts.
- A Curriculum Vitae or résumé (no more than 10 pages).
- An example of a syllabus from a previous class that outlines the faculty and/or student engagement.
- A letter of support (this can come from the chancellor, provost, faculty, student, administrator, or community partner).
- Commitment to attend faculty convocation if selected.

### **Eligibility**

Nominees should hold one of the following:

- A full-time faculty appointment -- tenured, or tenure-track.

The intent of this award is to recognize and honor faculty for their significant contribution to advancing the practice of civic engagement through teaching and scholarship and the University of Michigan-Flint.

### **Selection Criteria**

- Significant experience in teaching civic engagement: evidence of innovative ways of employing a reflective teaching methodology to connect community and public service experience with academic study. (Service here is broadly defined to encompass a variety of activities — including research, organizing, and advocacy — that address important public issues.)
- Evidence of engaged scholarship: scholarship of discovery, integration, application, and/or teaching, including, but not limited to, community-based action research, scholarship on the pedagogy of civic engagement, or research on the impact of civic engagement on students, the campus or the community.
- Evidence of institutional impact: demonstrated leadership that promotes

civic engagement on campus and/or within in one's discipline.

The Special Events and Awards Committee will review eligible applicants and select one faculty member per academic year starting with Fall 2009. University Outreach and Academic Affairs will be noted as the co-sponsors of this award with Olivia P. Maynard and Olof Karlstrom being recognized as the funders/supporters.
