- Associate Director of Academic Programs and Associate Professor (Director for the Professional DPT Program),
- Associate Director for Research and Associate Professor, and
- Associate Director of Academic Programs and Associate Professor (Associate Director for Post-Professional Non-Degree Programs).

Rank will be commensurate with experience and academic credentials with tenure on hire possible. Minimum Qualifications for all three Associate Director positions are:

- Earned academic doctorate (PhD, EdD, or DSc) in physical therapy or related field,
- Currently licensed physical therapist and eligible for licensure in the State of Michigan,
- Clinical experience in physical therapy,
- Academic teaching experience in physical therapy,
- Willingness to collaborate with students, working professionals and colleagues, along with commitment to shared governance.
- Active involvement and commitment to promoting a work and learning environment that is diverse/multi-cultural
- Demonstrated leadership and management experience in key areas of responsibility.
- Additional qualifications for each Associate Director faculty position are as follows:

**Associate Director of Academic Programs and Associate Professor (Director for the Professional DPT Program)**

- Demonstrated leadership and management experience in key areas of responsibility for professional education program, i.e. budgeting, strategic planning, CAPTE accreditation and assessment, collaborations and curriculum development, and
- Ability to foster an atmosphere of student centeredness within the Professional DPT Program and PT Department and promote positive alumni relations and development.

**Associate Director for Research and Associate Professor**

- Minimum of three years of research administration experience with external grants and/or contracts
- Demonstrated leadership and management experience in key areas of responsibility for physical therapy department scholarship, i.e. curriculum related to scholarship, management of PTD intramural research funds and research labs, assist faculty and graduate students with seek external grants, grant writing, acquisition of contracts, IRB/human subjects, and intellectual property and technology transfer, and

- Ability to foster and mentor faculty scholarship within the PTD and foster student centeredness for Graduate Student Research Assistants in PTD.

**Associate Director of Academic Programs and Associate Professor (Associate Director for Post-Professional Non-Degree Programs).**

- Demonstrated leadership and management experience in key areas of responsibility for post-professional non-degree physical therapy education including Residencies/Certificate Programs, Fellowships, and Life-long Learning and continuing professional development offerings, i.e. post-professional education budgeting, strategic planning, APTA credentialing, assessment, collaborations and curriculum development, and
- Ability to foster an atmosphere of student centeredness within the Post-Professional Non-Degree Programs and PT Department.

The Physical Therapy Department

- Is one of three departments within the School of Health Professions and Studies.
- Has a DPT curriculum based on Evidence-Based Practice and the Guide to Physical Therapist Practice.
- Has a deep seated history of shared governance with a commitment to excellence in teaching, learning, scholarship and service to the profession
- Is a dynamic environment
  - Transitional DPT program implemented in January of 2009, with international cohort in August of 2011
  - Clinical concentrations/certificate programs with optional residencies in five areas of specialization.
  - Student-Led Pro-bono Clinic (PT-HEART), and
  - The Urban Health and Wellness Center (UHWC) PT Clinic has opportunities to expand clinical practice and clinical research including APTA Connect software to track PT patient outcomes for research purposes.
