## GRE Fee Reduction Procedures

2018-2019

### Guidelines for Participation

- To be eligible for a GRE® Fee Reduction Certificate, an applicant must be a United States citizen or resident alien who is a college senior or an unenrolled college graduate.
  - College seniors must be (1) receiving financial aid through an undergraduate college in the United States, American Samoa, Guam, U.S. Virgin Islands or Puerto Rico, **AND EITHER** (2) a dependent, who has an Institutional Student Information Report (ISIR) that shows a parental contribution of not more than \$2,500 for the senior year, **OR** (3) self-supporting and have an ISIR that shows a contribution of not more than \$3,000 for the senior year.
  - Unenrolled college graduates must (1) have applied for financial aid, **AND** (2) have an ISIR that indicates self-supporting status and a contribution of not more than \$3,000.
- Individuals previously approved by ETS may retake a GRE test for 50 percent of the full test fee without resubmitting a new Fee Reduction Certificate and ISIR form if testing within one calendar year of their approval date. ### Procedures for Financial Aid Coordinators
