Schoolcraft College RN to BSN Transfer Guide

The School of Nursing at the University of Michigan-Flint (UM-Flint) and Schoolcraft College (SC) have prepared this transfer guide as an easy transition for SC students transferring to UM-Flint to pursue their Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree.

The School of Nursing at UM-Flint offers:

- **15 UM-Flint institutional credits awarded for passing the NCLEX-RN exam.**
- Accreditation by Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE).
- Highly accomplished professors who actively engage in teaching and research.
- Start any semester; Fall, Winter, Spring, or Summer.
- Complete your BSN coursework entirely online.
- Experiential Learning in Leadership/Management & Community Health close to home.
- Undergraduate certificate in Leadership & Management available.
- Study abroad opportunities.

Bachelor of Science in Nursing Requirements

- Completion of specific course requirements in general education totaling 120 or more credits.
- RNs must have earned at least a 2.75 GPA (on a 4.0 scale) in their ADN program.
- A grade of C+ or better is required for all Nursing program courses.
- A transfer student must earn a minimum of 45 semester hours at the University of Michigan-Flint, including the last 30 credits.

Transfer Guidelines

- Grade of "C" or better is required for courses to transfer.
- A minimum overall GPA of 2.0 is required to be considered for admission to the University.

The UM-Flint BSN program is designed to meet the needs of traditional students, returning students, and students already established in their professional careers. This guide illustrates course equivalencies and maps a curriculum plan that allows SC students to transfer with ease.



Required General Education courses that transfer

English Composition- 3 credit hours	-ENG 102 satisfies.
Social Science (S) - 6 credit hours	-PSYCH 201 and PSYCH 229 satisfies -MTA satisfies.
Humanities (H) - 6 credit hours	-Refer to transfer equivalency page online (3 credits will be fulfilled with UM-Flint nursing class). -MTA satisfies.
Global Studies (GS) - 3 credit hours	-Satisfied with UM-Flint nursing class.
Fine Arts (F) - 3 credit hours	-Refer to transfer equivalency page online.*
Health and Well Being (HW) - 3 credit hours	-BIOL 115 satisfies
Finance and Quantitative Literacy (FQ) - 3 credit hours	- Refer to transfer equivalency page online. * -MTA satisfies.
Natural Science (N/NL) - 4 credit hours with a lab	-BIOL 236 satisfies
Technology (T) - 3 credit hours	- Refer to transfer equivalency page online. *
Capstone (CAP) - 3 credit hours	-Satisfied with UM-Flint nursing class.

Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA)

Students who transfer from a Michigan institution with a completed MTA will have a majority of their UM-Flint general education requirements satisfied. A completed MTA will satisfy the following UM-Flint General Education Requirements: First Year Experience, English composition, Humanities, Finance and Quantitative Literacy, Natural Science, and Social Science.

Students who do not complete the entire MTA will receive a course by course evaluation of their transfer credit. For more information visit UM-Flint Admission's at www.umflint.edu/admissions.

1. Remaining program requirements may be completed through UM-Flint. Transfer students must earn a minimum of 45 semester hours at the University of Michigan-Flint, including the last 30 credits. The 15 credits for the NCLEX can be used toward these rules.
2. The nursing curriculum is 35 credits and must be taken at UM-Flint.
3. Catalog requirements are subject to change on an annual basis and students are required to follow the catalog under which they are admitted.
4. C+ or higher required in all nursing required courses.
