Mott Community College RN to BSN Transfer Guide

The School of Nursing at the University of Michigan-Flint (UM-Flint) and Mott Community College (MCC) have an articulation agreement to provide an easy transition for MCC students transferring to UM-Flint to pursue their Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree.

The School of Nursing at UM-Flint offers:

- **15 UM-Flint institutional credits awarded for passing the NCLEX-RN exam.**
- Accreditation by Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE).
- Highly accomplished professors who actively engage in teaching and research.
- Start any semester; Fall, Winter, Spring, or Summer.
- Complete your BSN coursework entirely online.
- Experiential Learning in Community Health close to home.
- Undergraduate certificates in Leadership/Management & Case Management available.
- Study abroad opportunities.

Bachelor of Science in Nursing Requirements

- Completion of specific course requirements in general education totaling 120 or more credits.
- RNs must have earned at least a 2.75 GPA (on a 4.0 scale) in their ADN program.
- A grade of C+ or better is required for all Nursing program courses.
- A transfer student must earn a minimum of 45 semester hours at the University of Michigan-Flint, including the last 30 credits.

Transfer Guidelines

- Grade of "C" or better is required for courses to transfer.
- A minimum overall GPA of 2.0 is required to be considered for admission to the University.

Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA)

Students who transfer from a Michigan institution with a completed MTA will have a majority of their UM-Flint general education requirements satisfied. A completed MTA will satisfy the following UM-Flint General Education Requirements: First Year Experience, English composition, Humanities, Finance and Quantitative Literacy, Natural Science, and Social Science. Students who do not complete the entire MTA will receive a course by course evaluation of their transfer credit. For more information visit UM-Flint Admission's at www.umflint.edu/admissions. 1. Remaining requirements (general education & nursing curriculum) may be completed through UM-Flint.
2. Transfer students must earn a minimum of 45 semester hours at the University of Michigan-Flint, overall of 120 college credits (including transfer & UM-Flint credits) and the last 30 credits must be at UM-Flint. The 15 credits for the NCLEX can be used toward these rules.
3. The nursing curriculum is 35 credits and a C+ (77%) or higher is required for the nursing curriculum.
4. Catalog requirements are subject to change on an annual basis and students are required to follow the catalog under which they are admitted.
5. This document is for information purposes only. Transfer credit is subject to change. Please speak with an UM-Flint representative before taking any additional coursework and to review your transcripts.
